In 1962, Anne Marie was born in California, the 4th of 6 children and daughter of active bowling parents. They took her bowling at age 16 and her father saw talent and a bright future for her. At 19, she was Southern California Junior Bowler of the Year, at 22 she was the Southern California Woman Bowler of the Year. At age 21 in 1983, Anne Marie launched her professional career and won the first tournament she entered (the only female to do so in LPBT). She set WIBC record for Four Games (1147); Tied world record for Three 300 Games and Two 800 Series in one year and was Rookie of the Year. Duggan went on to win 15 National Titles, 25 Regional Events and was inducted into the Women's Professional Bowlers Hall of Fame in 2003. She has also won the 1994 WIBC Queens Title, 1993 & 1994 WIBC Championship Tournament Classic Division Team Championships; 1993 Classic All Events Title. IN 1991 she won the BPAA US Open Title. IN 2005 at Tulsa, she was inducted into the WIBC Hall of Fame. For the past 20 years, she and husband Pat have called Edmond their home and have brought national attention to the town. Bowling in OKC leagues, her average has been Tops for years 2002-03 (218), 2005-06 (215), 2007-08 (218). Anne Marie has bowled over Twenty Five 300 Games and her Fifteen 800 Series ranks 2nd all time for women bowlers. Her 865 all time best includes 2 300 games and was a National record in 1993 and currently ranks 6th all time for women. She holds the Oklahoma State Series Record of 833. She is a Pro Shop Operator and Instructor and has helped many with their game. For her ability, outstanding career, coaching and contribution to our community the Oklahoma City Bowling Council proudly inducts Anne Marie Duggan into its Hall of Fame.
