Jackie has been a sanctioned bowler for 20 years. His top five league averages are: 211, 210, 204, 201 and 199. His high game is 300 and high series is 760. He is described as having a fine personality with the ability to get along well with others, a consistent and talented bowler, always a threat to win any tournament he enters. In 1961-62 he was top All Events Scratch in the Oklahoma City Tournament, in 1962-63 he won Oklahoma State Masters Tournament in Tulsa. In 1967 he was the high qualifier for Oklahoma All-Stars. He won Singles in Southwest Doubles at 66 Bowl in 1967. In 1975 he won the Doubles event in the Oklahoma City Tournament with Jack Edwards. In many other tournaments he placed in the Top 10 of the Prize List. In league play he has won many team and individual awards. In match play and jackpot he has some of his highest scores in this type of competition and is considered one of the top players in this category. He owns a composite league average of 195.3 for 16 seasons. For his consistent average as a league bowler as well as tournament and match play competition, the Oklahoma City Bowling Council inducts Jack Hurst into its Hall of Fame.
