Kent was a sanctioned bowler for over 40 years. He will go down in history as one of Oklahoma City's greatest bowlers. He bowled 4 years in Kansas City, 8 years in Tulsa and came to Oklahoma City in 1928. He was the first man to carry a 200 average in Oklahoma City, 1934-1935 season. His five highest league averages were: 205, 199, 198, 199 and 197. His four highest series were 778, 751, 716, and 717. He never recorded a perfect game but had several 299 games. He finished 3rd Place in Doubles at the ABC National Tournament in 1920 with a 717 series and Ira Pilcher as his partner. He won the Southwest Doubles in 1934 with 694 which stood as a record for many years. In an exhibition match he defeated ABC Superstar Otto Stein by 4 pins in a 5-9 match 1022 to 1018. One must agree Kent Spellman was an exceptional talent.
