To say Tiffany Stanbrough had a remarkable Youth bowling career would be an understatement. It truly is an unbelievably remarkable record. At age 12 she bowled a 696 Series ranking 10th Place Nationally. At 14 she bowled her first 300 Game and then another and was the only bowler her age with Two 300 Games. At 15, she held the World Record, 825 Series for YABA and won 21 Junior Scratch Titles. In 1994, at 16 she represented Team USA in the Lee Evans Tournament of Americas winning 3 Medals. In 1995 it was the Sooner Stat Games Athlete of the Year and in 1997 she won the 600 Club with an 816 Series. She won many local tournament and averaged 233 in 1999 (3rd Highest in WIBC). At age 21, it was time for the Professional Tour which garnered her PWBA Rookie of the Year. Here are some of her other Pro Titles: 14 National televised Shows; 2002 WIBC Second All-American Team; 2003 WIBC First All-American Team; Southern Bowling Writers Assoc Bowler of the Year; 2007 USBC Women's Singles Classic Champion (745); 4 National Titles; 10 Regional Titles; 3 8—Series in one PWBA event; 2nd All-Time PWBA record 1628 six game series; 23 300 Games; 16 800 Series....All in a span of 4 years from 1999-2003. She also set a National High Doubles Score at GTO in Tulsa with Shannon Pulhosky bowling 1585. She took off 2 years due to injury and to begin a business, but in 2003-04 she bowled again and held city high average of 230 and then again in 2006-07 averaging 231. For her dedication to the sport and phenomenal athletic ability, the Oklahoma City Bowling Hall of Fame is proud to induct Tiffany Stanbough into the Hall of Fame.
