Before moving to Oklahoma in 1966, Evelyn was a member of a top notch five sister group of bowlers in the Akron, Ohio area. Evelyn bowled with her 4 sisters in many tournaments and did quite well, even dominating their home town of Barberton, Ohio. Upon arriving in OKC, she sought out the Major Classic leagues to bowl in and quickly was on prestigious teams. It was then Evelyn was asked to join the Oklahoma City Women's Bowling Association and she took off blazing. Voted in as a Director, she was a tremendous leader and an organizer with a willingness to work with others. She was a Lane Representative for Holiday Lanes, Capitol Sports Center, Penn 44 and Moore Bowl. She was a Delegate representing the association at the WIBC National Convention 19 times. She was also editor for "The Alley Cat", a mini-publication for the Women's Bowling Association. She held the position of Association Director for 28 years and was elected Member Emeritus in 1996. Between Ohio and Oklahoma, Evelyn has bowled in 36 WIBC National Tournaments. Evelyn who is still a very active bowler maintains a respectful average, having a personal best 187 average, a 276 High Game and a 668 High Series. She has won a Team title and Doubles title at the WIBC State Tournament and has many a 600 plus series weekly honor roll scores that were high for its week in the 1960's and 1970's. For her many years of service to all phases of organized bowling the Oklahoma City Bowling Council proudly inducts Evelyn Stuart into its Hall of Fame.
