
KEN WAGNER Men's Service - 2004



Ken is being inducted in the Service Division, but is a very accomplished bowler and has always maintained a 200+ average. He began bowling at a very young age and was one of the first to bowl at the newly opened Windsor Lanes, being coached by Hall of Famer June Husted. His bowling accomplishments are: 1963-64 YBC State Champion; 1964-65 State Doubles Champion; City Team Champion 1984 & 2002; City Doubles Champion in 2003; City Mixed Doubles 2003; Finished as high as 3rd in State competition; 4th in Olympic Trials in 1989; high league Average 214; Five 300 Games; Six 290+ Games; Three 800 Games (high 841); received every ABC award except the Big 4. These are remarkable feats but Ken is being honored for his contributions to the Sport of Bowling. He has been a team captain for 20+ years, a league president 15 times, a member of the OKC Men's Bowling Association Board beginning 1983, Association President 1995-96 & 2002-03. He is a very active member of the association serving on many committees and also an association representative to the Bowling Council. He was instrumental in forming the OKC Mixed Tournament and has been Tournament Director since its conception. As a member of the Bowling Council his input has contributed greatly to the Hall of Fame selections. He also has emceed the HOF induction ceremonies the past 4 years. Ken is a great ambassador for the sport of bowling having bowled in many leagues, contributed to the annual championship and the High School program as well. His demeanor, generosity, love for the sport, all make him an excellent inductee to the Oklahoma City Bowling Hall of Fame.
